The Speedy Sloth Key Word Sign – Sign links



Please read the accompanying document "The Speedy Sloth - Key Word Sign Information Sheet" for more information about Key Word Sign and how the signs used in the video book reading have been selected, and at times modified.

Links to the signs selected are embedded in the key words of the text. Auslan Signbank is the source of nearly all these signs, however there is no Auslan sign for some words ("sloth" and armadillo"), and an ASL sign has been used. Some words have been represented by a natural gesture and finger spelling has been used for the first letter of a name. Other signs have been modified to better reflect the meaning of the text. These words have been colourcoded.
