

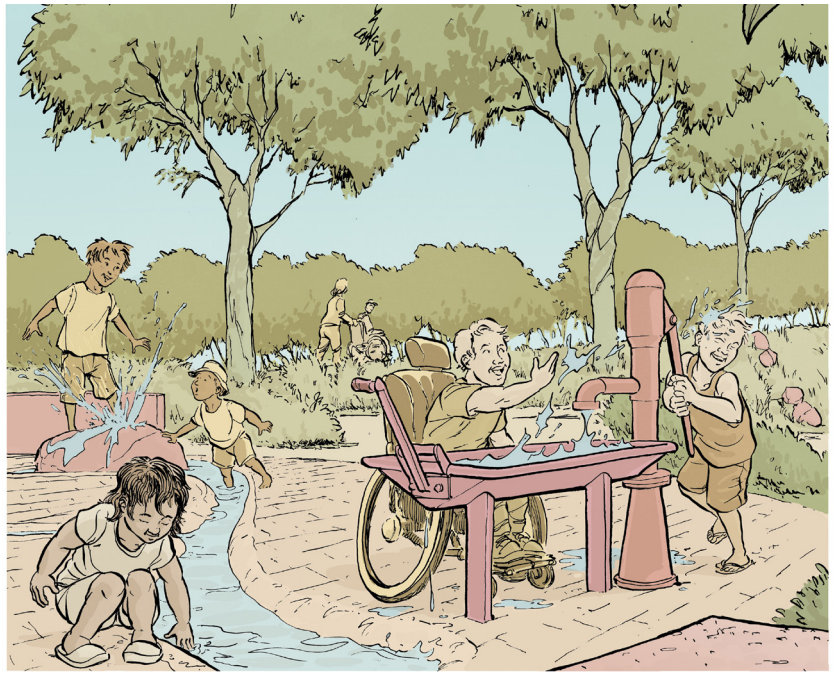

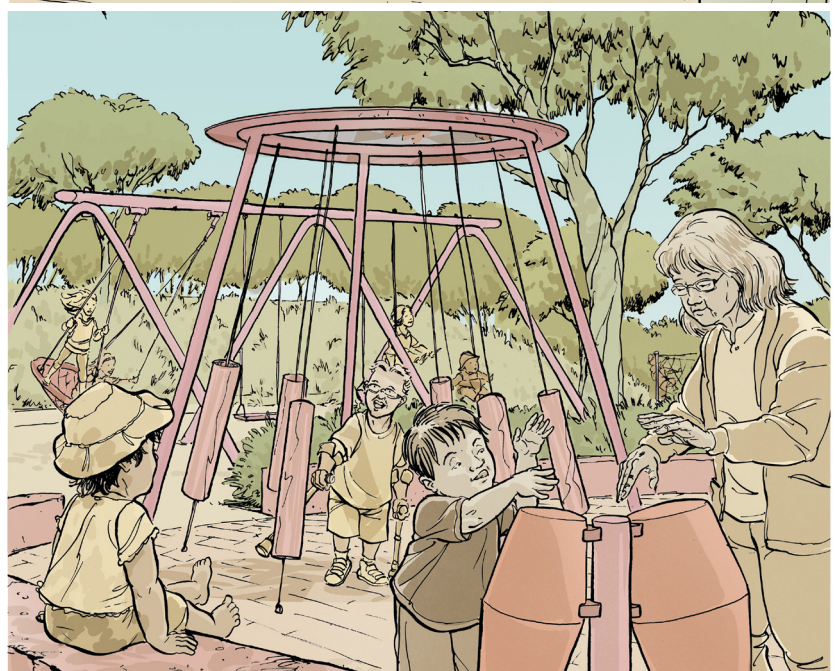

- We will write what the hard word means.



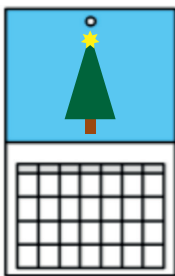
There will be a new playground in the city.

The playground will be in Rymill Park.

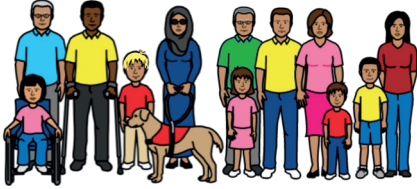


Everyone will be **included** at the playground.

The playground will be ready in December 2020.

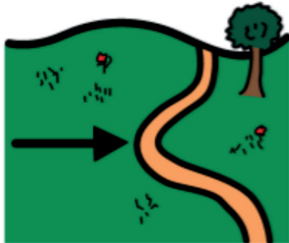


The new playground will be easy for everyone to use.

- Trampolines for wheelchairs



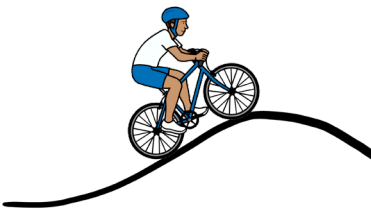
- Things to play with sound

- Swings



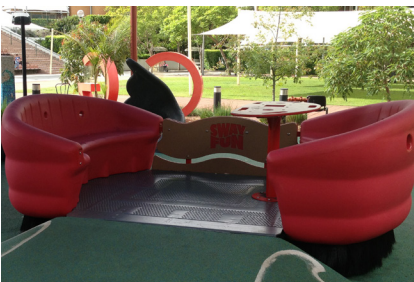
- Bike track with hills



- A carousel

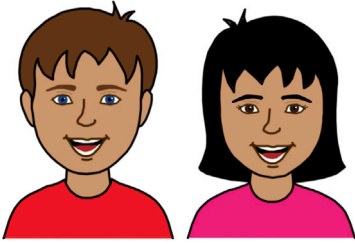


- A climbing net

Being **comfortable** means you feel nice and are being cared for.

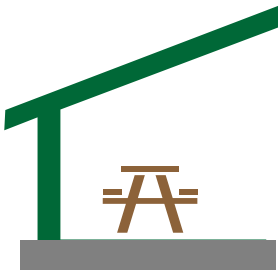


It will have:

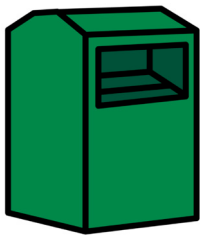
- Barbecues



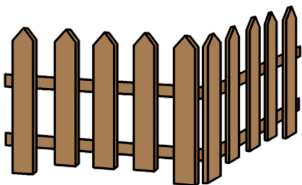
- Seats
