MEASURES TO PREVENT COVID-19 FROM ENTERING THE EAST ARNHEM REGION

Quarantine before entering the East Arnhem designated biosecurity area

People cannot enter the East Arnhem designated biosecurity area unless they can provide evidence that they have quarantined for 14 days before entering the area, or they are an <u>Approved Remote Essential Worker</u>.

Can I get help to quarantine before I travel to East Arnhem?

Culturally appropriate quarantine facilities to support people who need to use them are being arranged outside biosecurity areas.

We encourage Yolŋu and other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People to contact the following organisations for support to quarantine and return to the region:

Evidence of quarantine

All people entering the East Arnhem designated biosecurity area will be required to complete a <u>designated</u> <u>area compliance form</u>, outlining their planned social distancing measures and attaching evidence of quarantine. The Northern Territory Government is considering the types of evidence that may be submitted to demonstrate that you have quarantined in compliance with the Biosecurity Determination. Stay at home this Easter

Easter religious services

The Northern Territory Government has announced that there will be no Easter religious gatherings held in places of worship this year to help stop the spread of COVID-19.

Churches and other places of worship, will remain closed to the public with services now being live streamed to the community. Contact your local place of worship to find out more about their plans for Easter services.

Recreational activities

We encourage you to review <u>advice about how to stay safe and practice physical distancing</u> as we come into the Easter long weekend.

In particular, remember:

- No camping is allowed in any Dhimurru recreation areas and a number of Dhimurru sites are closed. Please contact Dhimurru Aboriginal Corporation on 08 8939 2700 for more information.
- Fishing is only allowed if you are fishing alone or fishing with someone who lives with you, and you are maintaining physical distancing.

Gove Pandemic Clinic and remote community Respiratory Clinics

The Gove District Hospital Pandemic Clinic is now open to facilitate screening for COVID-19 locally. Respiratory Clinics in remote communities right across the region are also ready to assist with this strategy.

Even though there are no confirmed cases of COVID-19 in East Arnhem currently, Miwatj, Marthakal, and Laynhapuy health services and Top End Health Services aim to ensure that we can detect the virus quickly if it gets to the region in order to contain it.

Please do not go directly to the Gove Pandemic Clinic or your local clinic for screening – you should phone first to make have an appointment.

Specific testing criteria are regularly adapted based on the staging of the pandemic and are based on the recommendations from CDC (Centre for Disease Control). At present, testing is mainly required if:

- you have returned from overseas in the past 14 days and you become unwell with flu-like symptoms.
- you have return from Interstate in the last 14 days and you have become unwell with flu like symptoms.
- you have been in close contact with someone known to have COVID-19 disease AND you become unwell.

Nhulunbuy Quarantine Facility

Nhulunbuy's Dawurr Boarding Facility will provide vital support to people required to quarantine during the COVID-19 pandemic.

There are no known cases of COVID-19 in East Arnhem.

The Nhulunbuy Quarantine Facility will initially provide accommodation to keep vulnerable people who cannot isolate at home safe from COVID-19. If it becomes necessary, it can also to adapt to help local authorities contain the spread of COVID-19 if it does enter the East Arnhem biosecurity area.

Additional physical security has been put in place for the safety of people accommodated at the facility as well as the broader community.

Top End Health Services is the lead agency for the Nhulunbuy Quarantine Facility, with the cooperation of the Department of Education and other Northern Territory Government agencies.

Arrangements have been made to support students of the Darwurr Boarding Facility to engage in distance learning while their school is used as a quarantine facility.
