

Political Issues Poll October 2023

CLIENT: NZ Taxpayers' Union

POLL DATES: Sun 01 Oct to Wed 04 Oct 2023.

The median response was collected on Wed 03 Oct 2023.

TARGET POPULATION: Eligible New Zealand voters.

SAMPLE POPULATION: Eligible New Zealand voters who are contactable on a landline

or mobile phone or online panel.

SAMPLE SIZE: 1,000 respondents agreed to participate – 800 via phone and

200 via online panel.

SAMPLE SELECTION: A random selection of 15,000 nationwide phone numbers and a

random selection from an online panel (that complies with

ESOMAR guidelines for online research)

WEIGHTING: The results are weighted to reflect the overall voting adult

population in terms of gender, age, and area.

SAMPLE ERROR: Based on this sample of 1,000 respondents, the maximum

sampling error (for a result of 50%) is +/- 3.1%, at the 95% confidence level. Results for sub-groups such as age and area

will have a much higher margin of error and not seen as

precise.

CODE COMPLIANCE: This poll was conducted in accordance with the Research

Association New Zealand Code of Practice and the

International Chamber of Commerce/European Society for Opinion and Market Research Code on Market and Social

Research.



The Government has proposed transferring planning powers over housing, business and environmental development from elected local councils to new regional planning committees made up of appointees from councils, central government, and iwi and hapū.
