Dear Parishioners,

Today I want to introduce another word – ‘Charism’ and to separate it slightly from the word ‘spirituality’. Both apply when we talk of us all living within a Passionist Parish.

A Charism gives rise to a Spirituality. We need to distinguish between the Passionist Charism and the Passionist Spirituality that gives expression to and flows from it. The Charism is the central truth of one’s vocation and by the grace of God’s call one is attracted to a Charism, embraces it, makes a home for it deep within, and lives from its inspiration. By contrast ‘spirituality’ encompasses all the ways in which one’s relationship to God is based upon, and built from, that same Charism – through personal relating, through prayers, devotions, actions, writings and acts of faith.

St. Paul of the Cross wanted all women and men to come to know and understand the essential truth of our Charism - the Passion of Jesus and its saving power. He not only began a religious order – our Congregation – but he wanted a movement for laity to be part of the growth of the Passionist Charism in the world. He collaborated closely with laity, formed many friendships with men and women, wrote more than 10,000 letters to various people to guide them in their spiritual lives and he associated friends, family, benefactors, and talented lay people with his mission throughout his life.

Apart from married and single people who live the Charism today in their homes and family life, in their work and ministry, there are also five major Congregations of women, and several other smaller associated Orders of men and women, that also live the Passionist Charism in the world of today.

In 2000, our Passionist General Chapter expressed the insight that all those who wish to stand with us at the foot of the Cross, to contemplate the love of God and then to proclaim its saving power to others could be called ‘Passionists’. Thus, many lay people live the Charism amid marriage, family and single life and in this sense the Passionist Charism has been ‘named’ - that is, identified, lived, and proclaimed - in and through various ways.

The experience of men and women – laity – who are part of the Passionist Family contribute enormously to the understanding and living out of our vocation in the world. They help to make the Passionist Charism a living, dynamic entity that is ever evolving and always being reinterpreted. The Passion of Jesus is God’s gift to the world, and it is so often revealed anew in the lives of our neighbours or indeed, our own.
