Competitive play is a crucial part in the development of players from grassroots participation to the international stage. Our mission is to ensure everyone has a rewarding tennis experience and this resource has been developed to give stakeholders wanting to run a tournament for blind or low vision players the guidelines to deliver a high quality event.

Event Rules & Regulations

The tournament will adopt ITF (International Tennis Federation) rules for standard tennis with the following exceptions: COURT DIMENSIONS AND NET HEIGHT



B1 COURT

- Dimensions: 12.8 m. x 6.1 m.
- Service line = 1.8 m. from the baseline and 4.60 m from the net.
- Net height = 83 cm.
- Tactile lines on all lines except service boxes.



B2, B3 & B4 COURT

- Dimensions: 18.28 m x 8.23 m.
- Service line = 2.74 m from the baseline and 6.40 m from the net.
- Net height = 90 cm.



THE BALL

- A standard audible tennis ball, manufactured by the company Shoei Industry Co. Ltd, shall be used.
- · Colour of the ball: YELLOW or BLACK
- Referee should determine default colour prior to event.
- By mutual agreement, if 2 players agree they can choose the colour of the ball for the match they are going to play.

RACQUET SIZE

 Any racquet accepted by the ITF in accordance with court sizes.



BLINDFOLD

- B1 players must wear a standard Paralympic approved blindfold.
- The blindfold may be removed only once per game and during change of ends.
- Players should signal to the umpire if they need to move the blindfold in any way.



O BOUNCES

- B1 & B2 = Up to 3 bounces.
- B3 = Up to 2 bounces.
- B4 = Up to 1 bounce.



VOLLEY

Volley is allowed for all the categories.



SERVE & RECEIVE

- Before starting the service motion the server must call "ready?" and wait for the receiver to reply "yes". The server then has up to 5 seconds to serve the ball but when served must say 'Play'. The server may not alter their position on the court.
- The server must shout "play" immediately before hitting the ball.



EXAMPLE: Blind tennis blindfold

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SERVER & RECEIVER

 Both the server and the receiver may ask umpire or ball people about their own position on court, in order to orientate themselves.

PLAYER LOSES POINT

- A B1 or B2 player loses the point if s/he does not return the ball before the fourth bounce (3 bounces allowed).
- A **B3** player loses the point if s/he does not return the ball before the third bounce (2 bounces allowed).
- A B4 player loses the point if s/he does not return the ball before the second bounce (1 bounce allowed).
 Note: At all times the first bounce must be within the court or, in the case of a serve, within the appropriate service court. Any additional bounces may be inside or outside the court.
- If the ball hits the player inside the court before the first bounce, it is a point for the opponent (all categories).
- If the ball hits the player when they are outside the court before the first bounce, it is a point for the player (all categories).
- If the serve hits the player inside the service box before the first bounce, it is a point for the opponent (all categories).

CATEGORIES

- B1: men & women
- · B2: men & women
- B3: men & women
- · B4: men & women
- 18/U Junior (mixed classifications)

CLASSIFICATION & CATEGORIES

- **B1**: Only B1 players can play in the B1 category. B1 players can also play in the B2, B3 or B4 categories, but must follow the rules for that particular category.
- **B2**: B2 player can play in a B3 or B4 category, but must follow the rules for that particular category.
- **B3**: B3 player can play in a B4 category, but must observe the B4 rule of one bounce.
- B4: players may not play in a B3, B2 or B1 category.
